2009 Plastic Surgery Statistics

Although it's been a sluggish year for plastic surgery due to the economy, the long-term outlook is more encouraging. According to statistics released by the American Society of Plastic Surgeons (ASPS), 12.5 million cosmetic plastic surgery procedures were performed in the United States in 2009, down 1 percent from 2008; up 69 percent since 2000. Nearly 5.2 million reconstructive plastic surgery procedures were performed last year.

Cosmetic surgical procedures decreased 9 percent, with more than 1.5 million procedures in 2009. Surgical procedures are down 20 percent since 2000. The top five surgical procedures in 2009 were:

- Breast Augmentation (289,000)
- Nose Reshaping (256,000)
- Eyelid Surgery (203,000)
- Liposuction (198,000)
- Tummy Tuck (115,000)

Cosmetic minimally-invasive procedures increased 1 percent, to nearly 11 million procedures in 2009. Minimally-invasive procedures are up 99 percent since 2000. The top five minimally-invasive procedures in 2009 were:

- Botulinum toxin type A (4.8 million)
- Soft tissue fillers (1.7 million)
- Chemical peel (1.1 million)
- Microdermabrasion (910,000)
- Laser Hair Removal (893,000)
